Homework Advice

Homework is effective in supporting learning when it is: related to the curriculum, consolidates, revises and/or applies student classroom learning, differentiated to individual needs, develops a student's independence as a learner and assists students to prepare for upcoming classroom learning.

At Holland Park, we have a whole school approach to homework.

According to the CARF (P-12 Curriculum, assessment and reporting framework)

Homework is useful if it:

- is effective in supporting learning
- allows sufficient time for family, recreation, and community and cultural activities
- does not disadvantage students due to a lack of access to resources

HOLLAND PARK SS RATIONALE

At Holland Park State School, we believe that homework provides students with opportunities to:

- consolidate their classroom learning
- establish a pattern of behaviour for lifelong learning beyond the classroom
- may involve family members in their learning

While homework is not compulsory, and is completed at parent's discretion, reading every night is an important routine to establish, that sets up children to be successful as readers and in life.

HELPING WITH HOMEWORK

You can help your child by:

- encouraging them to take responsibility for their learning and time management
- supporting them to complete tasks by discussing key questions and directing them to helpful and appropriate resources
- participating with them in online learning forums
- reading and playing games with them
- involving them in tasks; including shopping and cooking
- encouraging them to read and to take an interest in and discuss local, national and international events
